Step 1: Core Course Recommendations

- Your 8th grade teachers will recommend next year's core courses based on a variety of indicators including observations, grades, and standardized test scores. Recommendations will be shared with students by January 15th. (English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Language)
- Recommendations will be viewable in Home Access Center starting January 15th at 7PM.

Step 2: Research

Step 3: Select

January 15th - January 31st

- Enter elective choices in Home Access Center. **Complete this step by January 31st!** Home Access Center will close at end of the day.
- **Instructions:** Log into Home Access Center. First click the "Classes" tab, then click the "Requests" tab. Classes are found by clicking the "Edit" tab by department (Spend time exploring).

College Prep, Honors, Advanced Placement? Placement Questions? January 15th through January 31st

Your teacher will make his/her best recommendation based on a variety of indicators. You will notice these recommendations are locked in Home Access Center. If you disagree with a placement, your parent or guardian must take the step below.

Level Up Request (example: college prep to honors)--Your parent/guardian must contact the appropriate high school department chair **by January 31st for review**. Department chairs for core courses are listed below. If the request is approved, the high school counselor will be notified and make the change in HAC. Once the change has been approved, you will see Home Access Center updated.

Level Down request (example: honors to college prep)--To move down a level, select the lower level course in Home Access **by January 31st**.

Step 4: Carefully review your entries in Home Access Center

Deadline: January 31st

- You will want your total credits to equal 7.0. If you are moving down a level, then your total may be 8.0 or higher. The high school counselor will remove the higher level and verify the 7.0 credits.
- If there is a conflict with the courses you selected, you will be contacted prior to the end of the school year.
- **IMPORTANT:** Level placement is final as of January 31st.

Step 5: Elective Change of Mind

May 20th-May 24th

- During this week, you will receive course verification information. In addition, you may put in a request to change an elective. Instructions will be included at that time.
- Elective changes are not guaranteed and will be made on a space available basis.
- Core subject level changes will not be accepted at this time. See above regarding level changes.
